
Our progress to roll out results of our survey last year in a series of BRAIN bytes continues. In this section, we cover responses on the usefulness of our former website on Wiki.

Q8. What elements of the Wiki website have you found useful/helpful? (Check all that apply)

The top five list of things that were most useful about the Wiki website were as follows:

- 1. Mock written exams
- 2. Written exam overview
- 3. Study notes and outlines
- 4. Sample study schedules
- 5. Flash cards and study games

The full list of things that survey respondents found useful are included in Figure 1 (the Y axis reflects number of respondents endorsing each option).



Q9. What would you like to see changed or added to the Wiki website?

The most common comments for improvements included:

- 1. A section on tips and strategies from those who were successful in achieving board certification
- 2. Questions/details on practice sample preparation and examples
- 3. More commentary/ tutorials on integrative thinking: how systems connect, interrelate, with clinical presentation.
- 4. More tutorials / material
- 5. Update of written exam content
